


areth Hinds (b. 1971) has adapted numerous literary classics into graphic novel form, including *Beowulf*, an epic poem written in Old English and widely considered to be the most important and enduring work of Old English literature. Though its origin date is contested amongst scholars, a first manuscript is widely believed to have been created sometime between 970 and 1025 A.D. The poem was written by an Anglo-Saxon of unknown identity, but the story itself is set firmly in the Scandinavia of yore. The tale follows the heroic journey of Beowulf, who comes to the aid of a king to defeat the murderous monster, Grendel. In this excerpt, Beowulf confronts the gigantic creature.

"Therefore I shall carry neither sword nor shield nor coat of mail to this battle."


