The word appearance refers to the way that somebody or something looks to others. When something presents an attractive appearance, it is often judged in a positive way. Appearances, however, can be misleading. Two traditional sayings that warn against judging something only by its appearance are "You can't tell a book by its cover" and "All that glitters is not gold." The words in this lesson describe many ways in which people and things can appear.


